Teacher Induction: Essential Elements of Instruction

54 hours, PreK-12, Year long course

The Essential Elements of Instruction are just that, ESSENTIAL! It is time to refine your skills and remind yourself why you became a teacher... to engage students in the love of learning. This workshop focuses on foundational instructional skills such as classroom management, procedures and routines, determining an instructional starting point so all students experience success, and utilizing the principles of learning in order to increase student attention. Also covered is monitoring student progress, adjusting instruction, designing specific learning objectives and techniques for self-analysis. This course includes follow-up observations and mentoring throughout the school year to guide you in implementing your new skills. EEI is offered as a 6-day course, 3 days in the summer and 3 days throughout the school year.

Creating a classroom environment that is conducive to learning is a critical element of classroom instruction. At the core of every well-run classroom is a teacher who has clear expectations and consistent procedures and routines. Join as we examine how to keep your classroom running smoothly.

# The Ultimate Guide to Positive Student Relationships

## 3 hours, PreK-12

During this session, teachers will learn the basic principles for developing positive relationships with students. From the time they greet the teacher, walk in the door, and sit in their assigned seat, children have an overwhelming sense as to whether they belong and will be successful in their new classroom. Great teachers use proven strategies and make it seem effortless to reach out to students. How do they fit it all in and teach great content, too? If you build your school and classroom communities on relationships, mutual respect, and expectations with a Christ-centered focus, your students will thrive.

# Turn Parents into Partners

## 3 hours, PreK-12

Effective communication with parents is a critical part of all classrooms and often determines a parent's viewpoint of your classroom and school. This workshop will help you with strategies to effectively communicate with parents. We will work through problem solving techniques and skills for improving the parent-teacher relationship all while demonstrating professionalism and caring feeling tone. Walk away with tips and strategies on how to partner with parents.

# Active Participation

#### 3 hours, PreK-12

Did you know there is a direct correlation between classroom management problems and the lack of student engagement? Keeping students' minds cognitively engaged can be difficult. Learn research-based strategies to engage students in the learning process ALL the time.

## EEI Refresher

#### 6 hours, K-12

Has it been some time since you have reviewed the Essential Elements of Instruction? Is it time for you to brush up on your skills? Then this course is for you! We will review research-based practices for retaining information, such as including the following in your lessons: anticipatory set, closure, objectives, active participation, and elements of motivation.

You expect a lot from your students during those minutes!
